The following positions are up for election in the 2013 Lehi City Municipal election:

Mayor - four year term (Jan 2014 - Dec 2017)

City Council - Two (2) City Council seats each with a four year term (Jan 2014 - Dec 2017)

In order to run for election, candidates must file a Declaration of Candidacy form with the City Recorder during office hours and not later than the close of normal office hours between June 1, 2013, and June 15, 2013 and pay the \$35.00 filing fee. This means, the Declaration of Candidacy forms will be taken June 3, 2013, through June 14, 2013, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
