Vote By Mail

2015 Primary & General Election

Lehi City is conducting an all vote by mail for the Primary and General Elections. Ballots for the Primary Election will be mailed to registered voters on July 14, 2015. The registered voter fills out the paper ballot, places it in the provided security envelope and drops the envelope in the mail. There is no need to put postage on the envelope as Lehi City will pay the return postage. The envelope must be postmarked on or before August 10, 2015; OR a drop box location will be available at City Hall (153 N 100 E) on August 11, 2015, from 7 a.m.- 8 p.m. Registered voters can also surrender their ballot and vote in person at City Hall on August 11, from 7 a.m.- 8 p.m.

Verifying the Ballot

Voters must sign the ballot for it to count. Every signature is verified through the Utah County Clerk's Office.

Update the Address on Your Voter Registration

Ballots will not be forwarded by the post office, so please ensure that the address on your voter registration is up to date. Contact the Utah County Clerk's Office at 801-851-8128 or online at *vote.utah.gov*.

Benefits to Vote by Mail

Cities that have implemented Vote by Mail have seen a significant increase in voter turnout. West Jordan City saw a 150% increase in voter turnout and Moroni City saw 106% increase in turnout. It also allows more time for voters to prepare their ballots.

Register to Vote

Voter registration forms must be postmarked at least 30 days before an election in order to be eligible to vote in the upcoming election. You may register online at *vote. utah.gov* or in person at the Utah County Clerk's Office (100 E. Center, Room 3100, Provo, UT) up to 7 days before the election.
