As a city, we have a lot of great activities that Lehi citizens can participate in throughout the year. We hope Lehi citizens will take advantage and participate in these great celebrations.

Coming up in September on Labor Day, September 4th, at the Lehi Legacy Center from 2:30 to 6:00 p.m., will be the 10th year of Heritage Days. We encourage you to come and celebrate with us. The Roaring 1920s will be

the theme of this year's Heritage Days. There will be activities and displays featuring what it was like to live in Lehi during the 1920s. As the Historical Society did last year, there will be 20 more historic homes featured and eight individuals or couples honored for the service they have given to make Lehi the great city it is. This is put on by the Lehi Historical Society and sponsored by Lehi City. This is a free event and will have an honoree parade and celebration, 1920 displays, activities, Chick-fil-a, and a Classic car and Bike Show. Another great program coming to our city is the 'Lehi Historical Marker Program.' This program was inspired by the more than 2500 Historic Markers in the Pennsylvania Historic Marker Program. Laura Bangerter, the Director of the Lehi Historical Society, saw the Pennsylvania markers and thought Lehi needed something like that to feature some of the historic places in Lehi. John and Danaca Hadfield family. As a city we thank the Hadfield's for their donation and interest in this historical marker program. The following remark is by Laura Bangerter:

"As Lehi grows, it is important to pass on the history, peoples, places, and practices of those who went before so that we can stay true to our roots. Standing 10 ft. tall and placed in sidewalks, these signs will do just that. They will be identical in form and offer approximately three sentences about what happened at the location. Locations will include places like the Lehi Hospital, the Rodeo Grounds, Lehi Roller Mills, a location damaged by the floods of 1982-83 and the farm of George Goates of whom the men of Lehi came to his rescue in 1918."

The Lehi Historical Society and Lehi's Historic Preservation Committee have been working together to make the Lehi Historical Marker Program a reality. The public is invited to attend a Historic Marker Open House on Wednesday, August 16, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. In the Broadbent Community Room at the Lehi City Police Department (128 North 100 East). At the event, citizens can make suggestions for the location of markers as well as vote on their favorite sites for 36 markers to be placed in Lehi over the next four years.

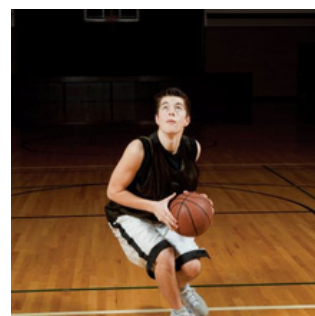
