

ANNUAL CITIZEN SURVEY 2017 PUBLIC OPINION RESEARCH





- I We refreshed our resident panel with this year's community survey due to incredibly high growth rates in Lehi.
- 2 Overall, city residents report a high quality of life and are happy with the way the city is being run – consistent on the whole with last year's findings.
- 3 All city services receive average approval ratings above 50 on a 0-100 scale, but movement from last year's evaluations suggests that residents have turned their attention towards city parks and city roads.
- 4 Residents prefer online forms of communication from the city.
- 5 Growth is still a major concern for residents now and looking toward the future.

SURVEY METHODOLOGY



Sampling frame of Lehi City residents consisted of a universe of email addresses from households in the Lehi City utilities accounts.



In total, we emailed 7,821 invitations, 742 bounced due to either incorrect email addresses or high spam filter settings, resulting in a deliverability rate of 90%.

Of the 7,079 delivered invitations, 1,816 citizens responded by completing online surveys. This results in a response rate of approximately 25.6% overall. Each email address could respond only once.



1,816 interviews among an estimated adult population of 33,162 results in a margin of error for the survey of plus or minus 2.26 percentage points. Responses were weighted to better approximate city demographic composition.

OVERALL DIRECTION


An overwhelming majority of residents believe the city is headed in the right direction, up slightly from even last year's high rating.



94% of residents rate their overall quality of life above 50 – with an average of 81 citywide.


All things considered, on a scale from 0 to 100, with 0 being very low and 100 being very high, how would you rate your overall quality of life in Lehi?



LEHI CITY ELECTED OFFICIALS


Elected officials in Lehi City receive a strong majority approval rating.

Do you approve or disapprove of how the Lehi City Mayor and City Council are handling their jobs?




RECOMMENDING LEHI

77% of respondents are satisfied with the service they receive for their tax dollar in Lehi.





LIKE MOST ABOUT LEHI


Consistent with last year's results, respondents enjoy the convenience and "small town feel" that come with living in Lehi, as well as the people and sense of community.


What do you like most about living in Lehi?
















This year, we added a dimension to our list of quality of life indicators – trust in the local government. 62% of respondents said that they trust the City to be open and honest. Only 8% disagreed with that sentiment.



We see some slight movement from last year's measurements on these indicators of quality of life. Total percent of respondents agreeing with each statement has decreased slightly.






LEHI CITY SERVICES

Overall residents are happy with city services and while we see some slight improvements from last year's evaluations, most differences are negligible. The most notable exceptions to this trend are parks and street maintenance, which received significantly lower ratings than they did last year.

The city newsletter and city emails are the highest ranked preferred information sources on average, consistent with last year's choices.


From which source would you prefer to receive most of your information about the City of Lehi?

PERSONAL EXPERIENCE WITH CITY STAFF


Just over one-third of residents have interacted with city staff in the past year.

And among those who have contacted city offices, a large majority of residents were satisfied with the responses they received.




MANAGING CITY GROWTH

MOST IMPORTANT ISSUE – TODAY


Respondents current concerns are still focused on growth, traffic, infrastructure issues in the city.

MOST IMPORTANT ISSUE – IN THE FUTURE


Similarly, with an eye towards the future, residents are most concerned about managing growth.



POST-ELECTION REVIEW


PRE-ELECTION BALLOT SIMULATION

The vast majority of support was soft – voters were willing to vote for the bond, but their positioning in the middle ground was vulnerable to opposition.



PRE-ELECTION AUDIENCES

We broke out our respondents into 3 distinct audiences, and the largest by far was the persuadable audience.



BALLOT RETURNS

In a post election review of our survey respondents – the same respondents who answered the preliminary bond research survey, results from our panel bore a strong resemblance to the Lehi general electorate.
