The Pioneer Spirit of Lehi

July arrives with a sense of pride ingrained in our hearts as Americans and pioneers of this remarkable land we call home. This month, we honor our heritage, our resilience, and the enduring spirit of Lehi citizens who have always stood as beacons of hard work and service to others.

As we prepare to commemorate Pioneer Day, our minds drift back to the brave souls whose sacrifices paved the way for the flourishing community we cherish today.
