At the opening ceremony for our annual community day of service, over 75 students from local high schools gathered at 8:00 AM on Saturday, September 7th —amazing! None of them were even born in 2001, yet they came ready to honor and serve. Lehi High School student Malia Blackwell shared,

“Nothing brings people together more than a common goal of helping others. Sadly, this goal arose after the tragic events of 9/11, but I want to go throughout this day with a view of all the good we can put back into the world, not the destruction of that day. Today is about unity and togetherness, to show that we have found a way to create good after disaster.” Skyridge High School student Millie Quigley echoed the sentiment, adding, “Service is one thing I really love about Lehi and our community. We have so many opportunities to help each other. I love how quick we are to ask each other for help, and to supply that help.”

Millie was right. That day, hundreds of citizens came together to serve, doing everything from planting trees to sanding toy cars. It was truly humbling to see so many people dedicating their Saturday to support the community. Up at the cemetery, five-year-old Paige Myers was hard at work with her family, using a rake taller than she was. Meanwhile, the Brown family was



spreading mulch at Willow Park for the second year in a row. Their 13-year-old daughter, Claire, said, “I just feel good that I get to help people.” Over by Dragonfly Park, 16-year-old Jacob Astin was working hard with his youth group. When I asked him why he came, he just shrugged and said, “Service helps everybody,” and then went right back to work.

If you didn't attend this year, I encourage you to join us next time—it will be well worth it, I promise. We owe our deepest thanks to those who organized this event and put in so much time and effort. They truly embody the spirit of "Lehi Serves." As committee member Glade Hamilton expressed, “When this tragic event occurred, the citizens of America came together in unity to serve one another. Hate, selfishness, personal contention, political differences, cultural differences, and strife took a back seat as people showed concern for others and served one another... Amid the crisis, love for others abounded. Though the events of that terrible attack have faded from our minds, September 11th serves as a reminder to preserve the civility that emerged from such an unfortunate incident. It's a day to celebrate brotherly love, show appreciation for the freedoms we enjoy, and honor the strength and goodness of the human heart.”
