

## **Morgan Stanley Lott**

### **1850-1950 Centennial Biography**

Morgan Stanley Lott, son of Benjamin Smith and Mary Abigail Evans Lott, was born July 30, 1886 in Lehi, Utah.

He was baptized by his father on August 5, 1894, in Lehi.

After attending school in Lehi, until 1902, he attended the Brigham Young University at Provo from 1904 to 1907.

Mr. Lott worked as a mechanic and an engineer at the Lehi Sugar Factory from 1900 to 1907.

He served in the old Lehi First Ward Sunday School as second assistant to superintendent George Southwick and was second counselor to Bishop Andrew Fjeld from April 23, 1913, to 1920 and served as first counselor in the Lehi Fifth Ward Bishopric from 1920 to 1928.

He served two terms as Lehi City Councilman, was a member of the Memorial Building Committee, and President of the Businessmen's Club, is a member of the Lion's Club, and was a member of the Lehi Stake Sunday School Superintendency. He also has been a member of the Utah County Fair Board, chairman of the Sugar Day's Celebration held in 1930, and was a member of the Old Folks Committee for six years.

Mr. Lott has contributed much to the development through his many years of service as an experienced plumber.

He was an ardent flower and shrub lover, having one of the most beautiful flower gardens in the community.

Mr. Lott is the father of four children and has six grandchildren.
