As we begin a new year, I want to reflect on the remarkable progress, resilience, and sense of community that define Lehi City. Together, we have achieved milestones that will shape our future while preserving the unique character that makes Lehi special.

In January, we welcomed Heather Newall and Michelle Stallings to the Lehi City Council. Their leadership and vision have already made a positive impact.

This past year marked significant advancements in our infrastructure and services. The groundbreaking of our new Civic Center laid the foundation for a hub of innovation and community engagement. Meanwhile, Station 84 opened on the city's west side, ensuring improved emergency response times and enhanced safety for our growing population. Lehi Fiber reached its first anniversary, with a full buildout expected by the end of summer 2025, ensuring connectivity for our residents and businesses. The 2300 West project is also underway, making essential improvements that prioritize accessibility, safety, and mobility for our community.

Our commitment to sustainability and quality of life shone brightly in 2024. We celebrated the conservation of 900 acres of open space in collaboration with Draper City and the Traverse Mountain Trails Association. Additionally, Lehi opened four new parks, including the much-anticipated Family Park, along with Holbrook Park, Salix Park, and Shadow Ridge. The Lehi Parks and Recreation Department earned the Utah Recreation and Parks Association's Innovation of the Year award for the Lehi Ice Rink – a testament to their dedication and excellence.

Literacy Center

The second session of our morning ABC Pre-K Program (Winter/Spring) will begin January 13 & 14, 2025 and run through May 7 & 8, 2025. 
