Engage for Change

We are smack dab in the middle of summer, and it is hot! I am so thankful for air conditioning! Could you imagine not having air conditioning? What a challenge that would be, right?

Challenges can be hard, painful, hurtful, beneficial, and rewarding. This last July two nephews (18 & 20 yrs. old) participated in the Silverton Alpine Marathon in Colorado. A 26.7-mile jog with an elevation change of 3000ft.

(9k-12.5k) One nephew (18) finished 21st out of 120. This marathon is extremely challenging for advanced runners, let alone first timers. Fellow racers said this was legendary! Regardless of when or how they finished, they finished! They accomplished an extraordinary goal that to me would seem impossible.

One of the most difficult challenges as a member of the City Council is the self-imposed expectation to please everyone. line. After completing the repair, they turned the water back on, and a few minutes later water was streaming again out of the wall. Shoot, for sure this was the fix....!

Now it becomes the resident's problem to solve. No problem, but how? What a daunting and overwhelming situation. I am sure questions like where is the leak? What's the cost? Where do I dig? Were "flooding" his mind.

After listening and observing to the resident, I returned to my car and contacted the Public Works department with the intent to listen. After listening I was able to conclude the breakdown in communication. Long story short, after listening and working together, the leak was fixed.

The problem was communication. The city thought they were helping; the resident thought his questions were clear. The intervention allowed all parties to step back, reevaluate, and readdress. Taking a step back to listen, evaluate, and readdress allowed a reasonable solution to develop that fixed the issue. Growth brings challenges. No argument from there! But I believe growth is not what we find most challenging. It is the change! Change is harder when we do not understand the why, what, or how. It is harder when we feel alone, abandoned or not heard.

Let's all take a step back, reevaluate and readdress. Change does not always produce a desired outcome, but participation in the process is more productive than hoping for change, which leads to not engaging.

Lehi City is a wonderful city. Lehi has so much to offer everyone. I love this city, I love the community, and all that Lehi can give. Let's continue to work together, listen to each other, evaluate, and address the issues together.
