# LEHI CITY

### A Legacy of Choice

With the passage of Proposition #11 in Lehi it's going to create a unique election cycle this time around, with seven board members being elected to serve on the new school board. Utah county is still deciding the boundaries for the board seats, but it's likely that Lehi will be able to elect 3 of the school board members and affect a 4th.

Those elections will be on top of municipal elections to decide 2 city council seats and the mayor.

Unlike most county or state offices all 6 elections will be non-partisan, meaning that none of the candidates will be running as Republicans, Democrats, Libertarians, or any other political party. That has not always been the case though. Prior to 1997, when Mayor Ken Greenwood was elected as a Citizen Party candidate, candidates for office were nominated in neighborhood meetings to either the Citizen's Party or the Progressive Party. Each party would nominate enough candidates to fill the seats that were available.

One of the challenges presented with the 2-party system in Lehi was it was difficult for outsiders to break into local politics. Following the 1997 municipal election two former Mayors, George Tripp (served from 1984-1989) and Ron Smith (who completed Mayor Guy Cash's term in 1992-1993) decided it was time to make a change.

At the time Mayor Tripp was serving as the party chair for the citizen party and Mayor Smith was serving as the party chair for the progressive party. They approached the city council on November 12, 1997, about ending the party system and it was approved.

That decision has fundamentally changed the political landscape of Lehi. The decision to remove party affiliation to run for office removed a litmus test of "how long have you lived in Lehi" to be able to run for political office. When I ran for office the first time in 2011, I had only lived in Lehi for 5 years and under the earlier system it would have been nearly impossible to earn a nomination. In contrast, during the 2023 election, we saw 17 candidates run for the 3 city council seats that were available.

As we begin to see candidates file to run for school board seats, mayor, or council I'm glad that party affiliation is not a limiting factor for anyone's ability to run for office. I'm glad that the citizens of Lehi are entrusted to pick the best candidate for the job w/out being unduly influenced by whether there is a "D" or an "R" in front of their name on the ballot. I'm grateful to Mayor Tripp and Mayor Smith that saw the wisdom in that, over two decades ago, that is still a hallmark for Lehi municipal elections!
